



BOYS AGES 12-17 WITH AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER NEEDED FOR EPILEPSY STUDY

WHAT IS THE GOAL?

We want to understand the brain responses of children with Autism and how they differ from those with Epilepsy.

WHO CAN BE A PART OF THE STUDY?

Males ages 12-17 with a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder and a diagnosis of Epilepsy.

WHAT WILL PARTICIPANTS BE ASKED TO DO?

1. Visit the Roberts Center for Pediatric Research
 - Your child will complete a number of tests to measure their motor and problem-solving skills.
 - Parents will be asked to complete a few questionnaires about their child's development.
2. Visit the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia
 - Your child will complete non-invasive brain imaging.

Participants will be compensated for their time in the study and may receive verbal feedback from the study psychologist summarizing their cognitive testing.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

While there are no direct benefits to taking part in this study, we hope your participation in this study may help other children with Autism and Epilepsy.
